

At a Glance

Hopkins Public Schools has one early childhood center ([Harley Hopkins Family Center](#)), six elementary schools that serve students in pre-K and kindergarten through sixth-grade, one Chinese immersion school ([XinXing Academy](#)), two junior high schools that serve students in seventh- through ninth-grade, and one high school that serves students in 10th- through 12th-grade. Our school district serves students in Hopkins, most of Minnetonka, about half of Golden Valley, and portions of Eden Prairie, Edina, Plymouth, and St. Louis Park.

Fun Facts

- All Hopkins preschools have STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) lessons embedded into the curriculum and they have a **FOUR-STAR RATING** from Parent Aware, a Minnesota quality rating and improvement program.
- About 96% of preschool parents rated the quality of Hopkins preschool education **EXCELLENT** or **GOOD**.
- Of the parents who attend our early childhood programs, 86% **FEEL CONNECTED** to the District.
- Parents overwhelmingly reported that what they like best about Hopkins Public Schools is **THE TEACHERS**.
- Hopkins Public Schools is **NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED** for its healthy school environments.
